1. Aims

Our SEND Policy and Information Report aims to:

- ✓ Outline how *Our Future Tutoring Services Ltd (OFT)* will support and provide for students with **Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)**.
- ✓ Define the roles and responsibilities of all individuals involved in delivering support for students with SEND.
- ✓ Ensure that all students receive equal opportunities, with tailored support to enable them to reach their full potential.

OFT values all students equally, recognizing and embracing diverse abilities and behaviours. Our goal is to meet individual learning needs while ensuring outstanding progress and successful transitions into further education or employment.

This policy is based on the statutory **SEND Code of Practice (2015)** and follows the **Children and Families Act 2014**.

2. Definitions

A student is identified as having **SEND** if they have a **learning difficulty or disability** that requires **special educational provision** beyond what is generally provided in mainstream education.

A student has a learning difficulty or disability if they:

- ✓ Have significantly greater difficulty in learning than their peers.
- ✓ Have a disability that prevents or hinders access to mainstream education/training facilities.

Special educational provision refers to **additional or different support** that is not ordinarily provided to students of the same age in mainstream education.

3. Roles and Responsibilities

3.1 The Director



The **Director** is responsible for:

- ✓ Working with the Head Tutor to develop OFT's strategic SEND policy and provision.
- ✓ Supporting key staff in ensuring the effective delivery of SEND support.
- ✓ Overseeing the implementation of EHC (Education, Health, and Care) plans.
- ✔ Providing guidance to staff, parents, and external agencies to ensure high-quality support for students with SEND.
- ✓ Acting as the main point of contact for external agencies, including local authorities.
- ✓ Ensuring compliance with the Equality Act 2010 regarding reasonable adjustments and access arrangements.
- ✓ Keeping SEND student records up to date.

3.2 The Head Tutor & Deputy Head

The Head Tutor (Eva Hilder) and Deputy Head (Deanne Phillips) are responsible for:

- ✓ Maintaining the SEND register on Bromcom.
- ✓ Updating and managing student records for those with SEND.
- ✓ Supporting tutors and staff in administering assessments for Access Arrangements, ensuring compliance with JCQ guidelines.

4. Types of SEND Provided for at OFT

OFT provides additional and/or tailored support for students with a range of SEND needs, including:

✓ Communication & Interaction:

- Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)
- Asperger's Syndrome
- Speech and Language Difficulties

✓ Cognition & Learning:

- Dyslexia
- Dyspraxia

✓ Social, Emotional & Mental Health Difficulties:

Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)

✓ Sensory & Physical Needs:

- Visual Impairments
- Hearing Impairments
- Processing Difficulties
- Epilepsy

✔ Profound and Multiple Learning Disabilities (PMLD):



Moderate to severe learning disabilities

5. Identifying and Assessing Students with SEND

5.1 Initial Assessment

- ✓ Upon entry, OFT will assess each student's skills and attainment levels, building on prior education records.
- ✔ Regular progress assessments will be conducted by tutors to identify students who:
 - Are progressing significantly slower than their peers.
 - Fail to meet previous progress milestones.
 - Experience an increasing attainment gap.
- ✓ If concerns arise, an **individual assessment** will be conducted to determine the required level of support.

5.2 Determining SEND Provision

- ✓ Special educational provision will be arranged based on:
 - Desired outcomes for the student.
 - Expected progress and attainment goals.
 - Parent and student feedback.
- ✓ If required, additional specialist interventions or adaptations will be introduced.

6. Supporting Students with SEND

OFT follows a **graduated approach** to SEND support:

Assess, Plan, Do, Review

- Assess: Tutors work with the Head Tutor/Deputy Head to analyze the student's needs
- 2. **Plan:** Identify the necessary **support strategies** and communicate them to relevant staff.
- 3. **Do:** Implement **targeted interventions** based on the student's individual needs.
- 4. **Review:** Evaluate effectiveness and adjust strategies accordingly.
- ✓ Tutors are responsible and accountable for the progress of all students they teach.
- ✓ OFT ensures that high-quality teaching is the foundation of SEND support.

6.1 Adaptations to Teaching & Learning

To ensure accessibility, OFT may:

✓ **Differentiate the curriculum** (e.g., 1:1 sessions, customized content, adapted teaching styles).



- ✓ Use specialist learning aids (e.g., coloured overlays, larger fonts, visual timetables).
- ✔ Provide longer processing times and pre-teaching of key vocabulary.
- ✓ Ensure instructions are clearly delivered (e.g., reading aloud, visual support).

6.2 Specialist Support

- ✓ OFT employs qualified tutors trained in SEND interventions.
- ✓ 1:1 tutor support is available where necessary.

7. Evaluating the Effectiveness of SEND Support

OFT monitors the success of SEND support by:

- ✓ Reviewing student progress each term.
- ✓ Collecting feedback from students and parents.
- ✓ Conducting monitoring sessions led by the Head Tutor/Deputy Head.

8. Emotional and Social Development Support

OFT prioritizes **student well-being** through:

- ✓ 1:1 mentoring sessions for students requiring additional support.
- ✔ Encouraging students to participate in enrichment activities to build social skills.
- ✓ Equality and Diversity Training to promote inclusivity and empathy.
- ✓ Implementing a zero-tolerance approach to bullying.

9. Admissions for Students with SEND

✓ Admission decisions for students with SEND and Education, Health, and Care Plans (EHCPs) are made by the Local Authority in consultation with OFT.
